Federico V. Magdalena (PhD Sociology, Univ of Hawai'i), is Associate Specialist and Adjunct Faculty in Asian Studies at UH Mānoa. He has taught courses in Sociology and Asian Studies, including an online course on sovereignty movements among Mindanao Muslims and Native Hawaiians, with Ateneo de Zamboanga University and MSU-Iligan Institute of Technology as collaborating institutions.

He has obtained federal grants, among these are the US Institute of Peace and the US Department of Education. The first allowed him to implement a peacebuilding initiative in 2015 for Mindanao State University, where history teachers developed a curriculum ingested with peace values. This became the basis for a university-wide course required for graduation, the FPE 101 or Fundamentals of Peace Education.

He received two other grants, which enabled him to direct Fulbright-Hays projects and train American K-12 teachers and students on Philippine languages in summer 2022 and 2023. The first one was conducted in Cebu and the second in Dasmarinas, Cavite, under the auspices of the University of San Carlos and De La Salle University. Both projects are now completed.
